- Engage in effective and accessible communication with elderly individuals and persons with disability to build trust, facilitate self-advocacy, and encourage disclosure of abuse.
- ✓ Evaluate real-life case studies, demonstrating critical thinking and decision-making skills through interactive role-playing exercises tailored to diverse situations
