Jobsplus marks another milestone in youth development with the ALMAAlta pilot project closing

The ALMAAlta project, aimed at supporting young people not in employment, education, or training (NEETs), is officially closing, marking another important milestone for Jobsplus. Piloted under the EU's ALMA initiative—Aim, Learn, Master, Achieve—the project provided tailored support to disadvantaged youth facing barriers to employment or training.

Launched in October 2023, ALMAAlta empowered vulnerable young people (18-29 years) with tools for personal and professional growth. Many participants had faced long-term unemployment, insufficient qualifications, disabilities, or migration-related challenges, hindering their employment prospects. The programme addressed these gaps through intensive preparatory training in Malta, focusing on soft skills, independence, and personal development. This was followed by a two-month mobility experience in Italy and Spain, where participants gained structured, work-related exposure. Through hands-on learning, cultural immersion, and mentorship, they developed resilience, adaptability, and confidence.

For participants, ALMAAlta was more than just a programme—it was a transformative journey. One participant, who took part in a mobility experience in Brescia, mentioned how the programme empowered them to become more independent and sociable, recommending it to others unsure about their future. Another reflected on how it helped them grow professionally and boosted their confidence, while a third highlighted how the diverse cultural experience expanded their view on people and life.

Analysing the outcomes of the 38 young people who completed the programme, notable achievements emerge; two participants were offered employment with their employer in another EU country, eighteen found full-time jobs in Malta, three enrolled in tertiary education, four pursued further training, and the remaining participants registered with Jobsplus for continued support. The depth of personal transformation and skill-building achieved by each highlights the programme's success.

Building on this, the initiative will be integrated in the new Youth Guarantee scheme, ensuring continued support for Maltese youth. With a budget of €780,000, Jobsplus will support at least 100 more participants, with 40 individuals set to take part in a similar mobility experience to further enhance their employability and life skills.

Jobsplus remains committed to fostering personal and professional growth among Maltese youth, particularly those furthest from employment. By equipping them with essential skills and experiences, ALMAAlta keeps strengthening our efforts to enhance youth participation in the workforce, ensuring a more resilient and inclusive labour market.

Jobsplus tilhaq tragward ieħor fl-iżvilupp taż-żgħażaġħ
hekk kif tagħlaq il-proġett pilota ALMAAlta

Il-proġett ALMAAlta, li għandu l-għan li jgħin żgħażaġħ li mhuma involuti fl-ebda tip ta' impjieg, edukazzjoni jew taħriġ, qed jagħlaq uffiċjalment, u b'hekk jimmarka pass importanti ieħor għal Jobsplus. Imniedi taħt l-inizjattiva Ewropea ALMA—*Aim, Learn, Master, Achieve*—il-proġett offra appoġġ imfassal apposta għaž-żgħażaġħ l-aktar żvantaġġati, li jaffaċċjaw diversi ostakli għall-impjieg jew għat-taħriġ.

Imniedi f'Ottubru 2023, ALMAAlta offra sostenn liż-żgħażaġħ vulnerabbli (18-29 sena) billi pprovdilhom għodod għat-tkabbir personali u professjonali tagħhom. Ħafna mill-parteċipanti kienu qed jaffaċċjaw qgħad fit-tul, kwalifiki insuffiċjenti, diżabilitajiet jew sfidi relatati mal-migrazzjoni, li fixklu l-prospetti ta' impjieg tagħhom. Il-programm indirizza dawn l-isfidi permezz ta' taħriġ preparatorju intensiv f'Malta, li ffoka fuq 'soft skills', indipendenza, u żvilupp personali. Dan kien segwit minn fażi ta' mobbiltà għal perjodu ta' xahrejn fl-Italja u Spanja, fejn il-parteċipanti kisbu esperjenza strutturata ta' xogħol. Permezz ta' tagħlim Prattiku, immersjonijiet kulturali u gwida professjonali, huma żviluppaw reżiljenza, adattament għal ambjenti differenti u bnew il-kunfidenza tagħhom.

Għall-parteċipanti, ALMAAlta ma kienx biss programm, iżda vjaġġ transformattiv. Parteċipant minnhom, li kellu esperjenza fi Brescia, semma kif din l-esperjenza għenitu jsir aktar indipendenti u soċjevoli, u jirrakkomanda l-inizjattiva lil dawk li huma inċerti dwar il-futur tagħhom. Parteċipant ieħor, irrifletta dwar kif kiber professjonalment u żied is-sens ta' fiduċja fih innifsu. Persuna oħra enfasizzat kif l-esperjenza ta' kulturi differenti wessgħet il-perspettiva tagħha dwar in-nies u l-ħajja.

L-analizi tar-riżultati ta' 38 żagħżuġħ li lestew il-programm turi kisbiet notevoli; żewġ parteċipanti ġew offruti impjieg f'pajjiż ieħor tal-UE, tmintax sabu impjieg fuq bażi 'full-time' f'Malta, tlieta daħlu fl-edukazzjoni terzjarja, erbgħa segwew taħriġ ulterjuri, u l-kumpliment irreġistraw ma' Jobsplus għal aktar appoġġ. It-trasformazzjoni personali u l-ħiliet miksuba minn kull parteċipant jenfasizzaw is-suċċess tal-programm.

Biex nibnu fuq dan, l-inizjattiva se tkun integrata fl-iskema l-ġdida *Garanzija għaž-Żgħażaġħ*, li tiżgura appoġġ kontinwu għaž-żgħażaġħ Maltin. B'baġit ta' €780,000, Jobsplus se tilqa' mill-inqas 100 parteċipant ieħor, inkluż 40 individwu li se jieħdu sehem f'esperjenza simili ta' mobbiltà biex ikomplu jtejbju l-ħiliet tagħhom fl-impjieg u fil-ħajja.

Jobsplus tibqa' impenjata li trawwem dan it-tkabbir personali u professjonali fost iż-żgħażaġħ Maltin, b' mod partikolari dawk l-aktar imbiegħda mill-impjieg. Billi tipprovdilhom ħiliet u esperjenzi essenzjali, ALMAAlta tkompli tikkontribwixxi lejn iż-żieda fil-parteċipazzjoni taż-żgħażaġħ fis-suq tax-xogħol, filwaqt li tiżgura suq tax-xogħol aktar reżiljenti u inklużiv.
